Traveling to Oregon Star Party

We strongly suggest printing the following route information for your use. GPS has proven to be fallible in the Ochocos. Cellphone service can be extremely spotty and unreliable in the area.

We would like to remind everyone that sunset in mid-August is around 8:00 PM. Please try to arrive before dark. But if you are unable to do so, be cautious of deer or other animals on the roads, particularly around dusk or dawn. In normal year's you could anticipate an 1 to 1.5 hours drive from Prineville to the site, however, with heavy eclipse traffic expect longer commute times. Roads are paved except for the last four miles, which are gravel and in good shape.

- Those arriving after 8pm should plan on spending their first night parked at the entry Late Night Arrival Area.
- The road into the main area will be blocked and you will be asked to camp in the late night arrival area near the entry gate. The road will reopen at 10am in the morning.
- We have had some trouble in the past with local hunters removing our signs, so if you follow the mileages listed, you will find OSP without any problem.
- 1. Please check the Oregon Department of Transportation web page tripcheck (tripcheck.com) for up-todate road information. The link for Incident Maps will take you to a 9 section grid. The Indian Trail Spring site is in Central Oregon. The site is east of Prineville along Highway 26.
- 2. If you need additional directions. A good idea is to pick up either a Pittmon map for Crook County, or a National Forest Service map of the Ochoco's for detailed information about the area.

Warning

Due to the large crowds expected in Central Oregon for this year's eclipse and the fact that Symbiosis will exclusively using Forest Service road 42 (OSP's traditional entry road) we are trying to give you some alternatives for travel to the Oregon Star Party. It is expected that some traffic jams may be as long as several hours. Solarfest (Madras), Oregon Eclipse 2017 (Symbiosis), and Oregon Star Party all begin on the same day. From Eastern Oregon, Eastern Washington, & other states:

Coming from places east of Indian Trail Spring, there are several options. From the north and east several good paved roads lead eventually to the town of Mitchell along Hwy 26. It is recommended that those coming in from this direction continue west on Hwy 26 to the turnoff for the Ochoco Ranger Station Road.

There are several gravel Forest Service roads that can be taken if one has an Ochoco National Forest map and feels comfortable with navigating back roads. But it is always a good idea to contact the Forest Service right before OSP to make sure these roads are open.

From Western Oregon, Western Washington, and California:


Oregon Star Party is discouraging people from using highway 97 down from the Washington border and highway 26 over Government Camp. We suggest that you use Interstate 5 down to highway 22 (Salem), highway 20, or highway 58 (Eugene) for travel east.

Once in Central Oregon, additional backup can be expected around the Prineville area. In many instances Oregon Star Party, Symbiosis, and Mitchell will be using the same routes. Traffic can be expected to be heaviest on highway 26 from Madras to Mitchell and highway 126 from Redmond to Prineville. Gas shortages may become an issue in Central Oregon, we suggest you fill your gas tanks before travelling to Oregon Star Party (i.e. Redmond or Bend).

Some paved routes you might consider (See Central Oregon Map):

- Highway (O' Neil highway) 370 between Redmond and Prineville
- Highway 20 alternatives from Bend (The first two routes will shorten your time on highway 126):
 - Highway 20 to Powell Butte highway. North on Powell Butte highway to highway 126. East on highway 126 to Prineville.
 - Highway 20 to Powell Butte highway. North on Powell Butte highway to Alfalfa Market road/ Willard road/Reservoir road (it's all the same road). East on Alfalfa Market road to George Millican road. North on George Millican road to highway 126. East on highway 126 to Prineville.
 - Highway 20 to Powell Butte highway. North on Powell Butte highway to Alfalfa Market road/ Willard road/Reservoir road (it's all the same road). East on Alfalfa Market road to Crooked River highway (Hwy 27). North on Crooked River highway to Prineville. Note this route should only be attempted by small rigs due to sharp turns in the Crooked River Canyon. This route can be used to avoid highway 26 in Prineville and east. When coming into Prineville turn right on Lynn Blvd. (just after Crook County Fairgrounds). Proceed to Paulina Hwy. See Alternate Route.

From Prineville to Oregon Star Party

The following pages describes two route that you can use to get to Oregon Star Party from Prineville:

The Regular Route will take you out highway 26 to Forest Service road 42. Please note this is the same route that Symbiosis is using to get 35,000 people into their site. Traffic will be heavy at times.

The Alternative Route will take out highway 380 to Paulina, north to Forest Service road 42, and then west to Big Summit Prairie. Although 46 miles longer, this route will be considerably less crowded.


Highway 26 Route: Prineville to Oregon Star Party

If you plan to return to Prineville by way of the Alternative Route be aware of one intersection on the unpaved portion of the route. The intersection is about 4 miles east of Deep Creek CG. Turning left will take you Big Springs CG the right turn will take you to Paulina and eventually Prineville.
